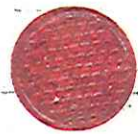

second part Whereas by an Indenture dated
the sixth day of March One thousand eight
hundred and forty being a Deed of Conveyance and
Trust of the Hereditaments hereinafter particularly
described for the use of a certain Society or
Congregation of Protestant Dissenters of the
Independent Denomination in Bawrow upon

Trent aforesaid the said George Sale, together with the other persons parties to the said Indenture were duly constituted Trustees of the said hereditaments upon the trusts therein mentioned And whereas the said George Sale being the sole surviving Trustee of the said hereditaments, at a church meeting of the members of the said society, duly held in accordance with the provisions of the said trust deed on the fourteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and eighty one the parties hereto of the second part were duly constituted Trustees of the said hereditaments jointly with the said George Sale the surviving Trustee as aforesaid Now this Indenture witnesseth that in order to vest the said hereditaments in the said parties hereto of the second part jointly with the said George Sale He the said George Sale Doth hereby grant and convey to himself the said George Sale and the parties hereto of the second part That piece or parcel of land or ground containing by admeasurement

superficial square yards or thereabouts part and parcel of a certain close called the Mead situate at B, arrow upon Trent aforesaid formerly the property of William Bancroft and afterwards of William Sale

And also all that chapel or edifice and other
buildings erected thereon with the appurtenances
To hold unto and To the use of the said
George Sale and the parties hereto of the second
part as joint tenants Subject nevertheless
to the trusts and with under and subject
to the powers and provisions mentioned and
contained in the hereinbefore recited Indenture
of the sixth day of March One thousand eight
hundred and forty Witness whereof the
said parties to these presents have hereunto set
their hands and seals the day and year
first before written.
